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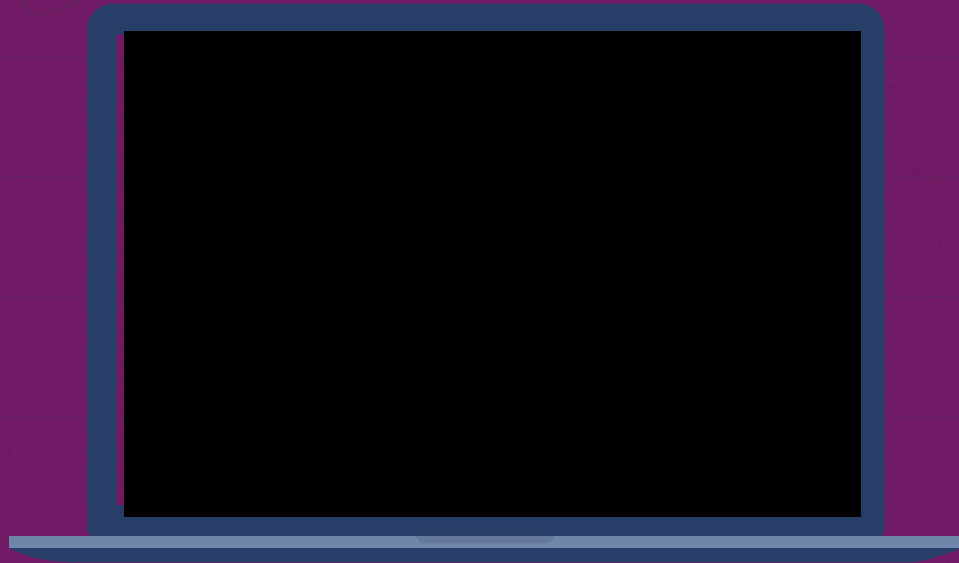

Divisibility Rules

You need:

1 deck of cards, numbers and aces only



How to Play:

- Place the cards FACE DOWN in a stack.
- Turn over the top 2 cards in the deck and place them face up in the middle.
- This number is base of the first round.
 - Ex: You turn over a 2 and a 5. The number could either be 25 or 52 (dealer's choice).
- The next player draws the top card from the deck.
- If the number on the table is divisible by the number you drew, keep the card. If not, put it in the discard pile.
- Take turns around the circle.
- After everyone has gone, draw 2 more cards and start again with the new number.
- The player with the most cards when the deck runs out wins!

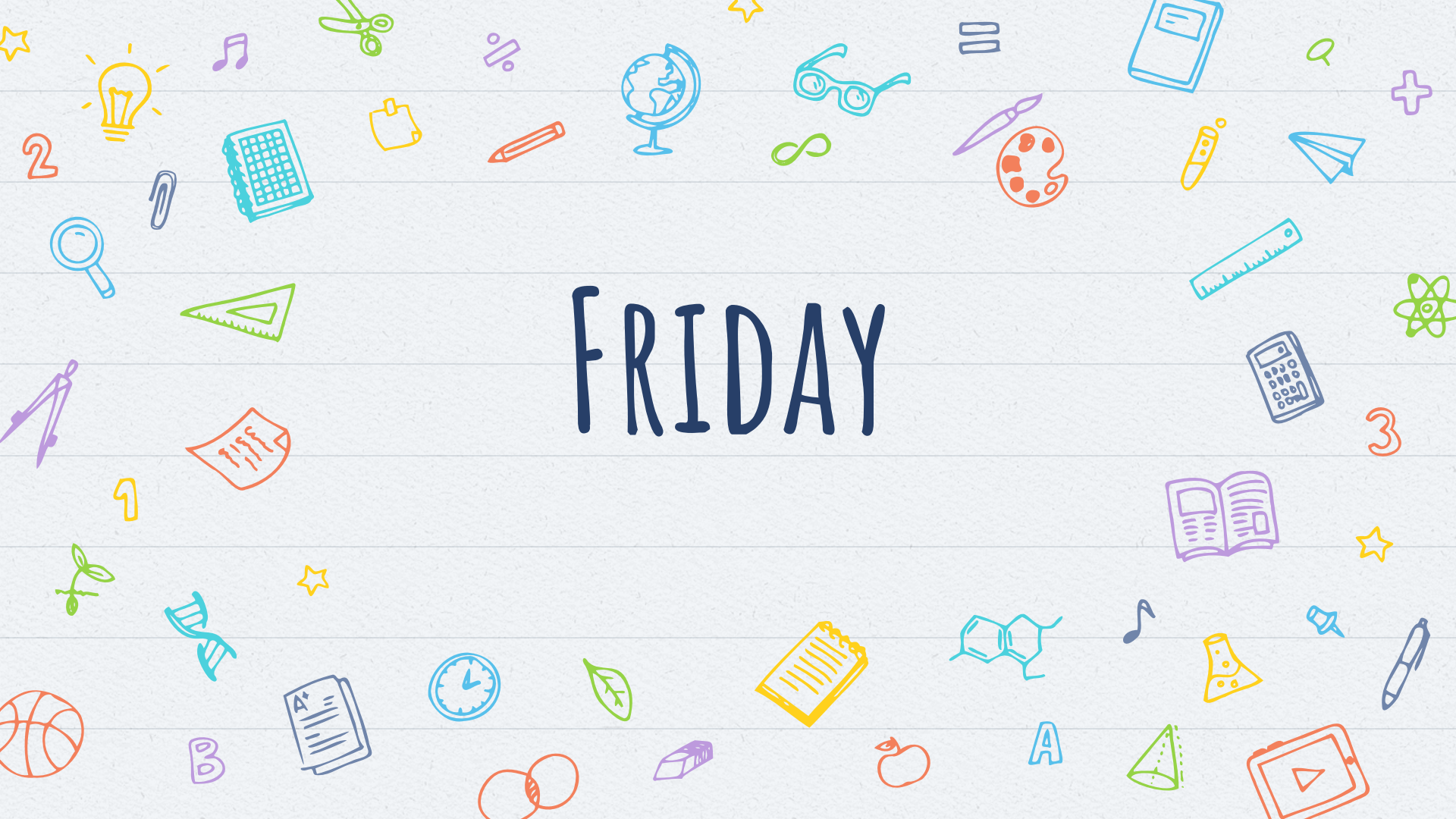
